AWARD-WINNING FILM BASED ON THE 1992 GLASGOW NOVEL BY ALASDAIR GRAY.

The Glasgow cityscape has been replaced by that of London. The fictional origin of the story, with the discovery of a manuscript in a derelict solicitor's office in Glasgow City centre, relates to the rescue of the office contents by Glasgow City Archives and the subsequent enforced destruction of them on the orders of the owner, Lord Provost Peter McCann.

Alasdair Gray was not a recognised

member of the 'cultural workforce' in the years when Glasgow celebrated the culture of capitalism. He memorialised the Lord Provost McCann in the character of Archibald McCandless, the doctor who marries Bella Baxter, the woman resurrected using the brain of the foetus she was carrying when she drowned herself at Glasgow Green.

McCann in life championed the disabled and the anti-abortion cause, bringing Mother Teresa from Calcutta for a demonstration on the Green in 1982.


Enjoy the film. It may seem bizarre, but it's less grotesque than the cultural situation in Glasgow which begat it.

MOBILISING AND ORGANISING

IT IS ALWAYS INTERESTING looking west's war machine. Children in these over the past year when looking forward to the next.

To plan and reflect on where we need to go next. But last year and this year has one big on-going horror story that supplants all others and is halting people in their tracks. That is the genocide of the Palestinian people by the US-sponsored Zionist project of Israel

But what also needs to be kept in focus is that amidst the tragedy of Palestine. there is also the courage, determination and historic resistance of ordinary Palestinians against their occupiers. The question is: what learning was needed to build that resistance? And what can ordinary people here, learn from that and from their own history of struggle?

SOLIDARITY

Maybe one of the best way to help Palestinians and to reach more people. is to understand what the bombs on Gaza set out to destroy. Namely, a deep belief in freedom, of solidarity, of tradition. of mutual aid and It needs to be camaraderie. remembered Arabs. Jews and many others of different religions lived peacefully together before Zionism raised its ugly head.

"It takes a village to raise a child" they say. Something that is well understood in Palestine and in the many villages of the countries under the bombs of the

places learn about human rights when they are young and carry that knowledge into adulthood.

MUTUAL AID

While here, we can mobilise millions on to the streets during a conflict, we need to remember that, this is not organising. Mobilisation, is different from organising. You can not create self determined communities through mobilisation alone, we need local organising. We need to look again at our own villages and to help engender in them a deeper belief in freedom, solidarity, tradition, mutual aid and camaraderie. Ideas that are learned by every Palestinian, that gives them the strength to resist.

We, also need that kind of strength today to support them and to build in our own communities resistance to our states violence against Palestinians. As well as to the worsening domestic and economic policies against ourselves that will also be part of the direct consequence of this genocide, along with our Governments neoliberal policies and its compliance to US and Israeli interests of world domination.

Think globally, act locally, it is time Internationalism and resurgence of the community teachin. Because the neoliberal brute will not be tamed unless we all start to think and learn like Palestinians, in their resistance to domination.


While the system protects the wealth of the very rich and turns a blind eve to tax avoidance, it has decided that it will now snoop on the bank details of the poorest and most vulnerable. Data Protection and Digital Information Bill gives government unhindered access to bank

accounts of 22.4m people. No court order is needed, government does not have to notify anyone. Be afraid, very afraid. Our liberties are vanishing like an early morning mist.

Our political ballerinas have now dictated that our energy bills will rise by 5% this coming term. Can this be justified when we consider that one energy company, Scottish Power, managed £487 million in profit for year 2022, a considerable jump compared to the previous year. SCOTLAND'S LASCAR HERITAGE: Investigating the Lives of South Asian Mariners

GLASGOW MUSEUMS AND GLASGOW LIFE (the ALEO which manages them) rarely stray into the paths of social history publication, so this book is to be warmly welcomed. The research for it was stimulated by the collection of a cast iron plaque inscribed 'Lascars Only' in English and Bangla script, from a former lavatory facility on Stobcross Quay.

'Lascars' or 'coolies' were Asian sailors, and the book looks at their presence in Glasgow in detail. The only disappointment is that there is no mention of Sir William Burrell who made his fortune by commissioning ships to be crewed by lascars only.

With smaller bodies, they were given less space, ate less food and received much lower wages than British sailors. The profits from 'Lascar Heritage' funded the Burrell Collection.

Buy this book. It might fund a future book on Scotland's Keelie Heritage. if Glasgow Life ever get around to dealing with local history.

DISTURBING TO SEE graffiti scrawled in the city centre saving 'Gaza: a 'real' genocide'.

In Glasgow in the 1930s, the Jewish Workers Circle had their clubrooms at Gorbals Cross, with twin portraits of Marx and Bakunin prominently displayed. They played a key role in ridding the city of Lord Haw-Haw and his fascist demolishing blackshirts, platform at Queens Park gates.

CEASEFIRE BEGINS AT HOME

WORKERS FOR A FREE PALESTINE and other groups staged a blockade at the BAE Systems shipyard in Glasgow on the 7th December.

Protests were held at three entrances to the site in Govan, previously Fairfields shipyard.

The campaign group also blockaded defence factories in Dorset, Brighton and Lancashire.

It urged BAE Systems to end ties with Israel and cease all weapons, defence and supplies trading.

Workers for a Free Palestine said BAE Systems produces components of weapons sold to Israel - including the F35 combat aircraft and the Mk 38 Mod 2 machine gun.

THREE PALESTINE ACTION supporters are due to be sentenced this month for halting production at Thales factory in Linthouse Road in June 2022, with a rooftop occupation.

Thales, one of the world's largest suppliers of military weapon produces military drones, armoured vehicles and missile systems,

The group said it targeted the company partly due to its collaboration with Israeli weapons company Elbit Systems on the Watchkeeper Drone project.
